INSTRUCTIONS FOR AUTHORS

General information

The journal “Advances in Andrology Online” is a periodical appearing every 6 months (half-yearly) in the electronic version. The journal publishes papers in the field of physiology and pathology of the male reproductive system. Topics include both clinical issues (pathogenesis, diagnosis and treatment of disorders) and experimental results. The journal accepts original papers, review articles and case reports. In addition, it will publish letters to the Editor, abstracts, and translations of English-language papers, information about the activities of the Polish Society of Andrology, announcements about scientific conferences and reports, and summaries of presentations from scientific congresses and conferences in Poland and abroad.

Article processing charge

The journal does not charge any fees for the preparation, publishing and distribution of articles except for commercial advertisements.

Ethical responsibilities of authors

The ethical procedures used in *Advances in Andrology Online* were created basing on guidelines from the Committee on Publication Ethics (COPE), the European Association of Science Editors (EASE), the International Committee of Medical Journal Editors (ICMJE) and the World Association of Medical Editors (WAME) whose purpose is to maintain the integrity of research and its presentation. A manuscript submitted to the Editorial Office must comply with the following criteria:

- The paper has not been published previously partly or in full (self-plagiarism), except for congress materials unless the new paper concerns an expansion of earlier published data.
- The paper has not been submitted for publication simultaneously to various journals.
- The data obtained from original research should not be published in parts in order to increase the number of publications („salami” publications), but as

a whole. Such intention is unethical and unacceptable. However, it is allowed to present the data in parts if the aim is to obtain a transparent interpretation of the results and analysis of specific results in different manuscripts.

- No data included in the manuscript has been fabricated and/or manipulated.
- The authors should be prepared to submit suitable documentation including access to all original data for the purpose of verification of the results.
- The publication does not violate the copyright of other people. The presented data, texts and theories are not plagiarism. The authors should cite the publications of other authors and their own research team which are necessary for the analysis and interpretation of the presented data.
- All the authors should provide significant scientific contribution in the research, as well as participate in the writing and reviewing of the manuscript. The authors share a group responsibility and individual responsibility for the results. They have completed and signed the authors’ statement (<http://www.postepyandrologii.pl/pdf/Authors Statement.pdf>), thus accepting the submission of the paper to be published.
- Honorary authorship is prohibited.
- Adding and/or deleting authors, and/or changing the order of the authors’ names at the time of review may be allowed and requires a written justification and approval from all the authors. Any changes in authors’ names and/or order of the authors’ names are not accepted after the manuscript has been approved for publishing.
- The authors are obliged to disclose in the manuscript all the research funding sources. If a manuscript submitted to the Editorial Office does not comply with the above criteria, the Editorial Office has the right to reject the article and return it to the Author.

Research involving human participants and/or animals

All research conducted on human participants should comply with the generally accepted ethical standards

specified in the 1964 Declaration of Helsinki and its later amendments, or comparable ethical standards. All research done on animals should be in accordance with international, national and/or institutional guidelines concerning the care and use of animals. Information about the consent of the relevant Ethics Committee to conduct the research and the patients' informed consent to participate in the research should be included in the subsection "Material and methods". In the case of retrospective research such consent is not required. The authors of case studies are obliged not to reveal any personal details of the presented patients, and in case of photographs enabling to identify the patient, a written consent of the patient is always needed.

■ Conflict of interest

The paper should disclose any financial and personal relationships of the authors with other people or organisations which might inappropriately influence their papers. Any possible conflict of interest should be described in the authors' statement (<http://www.postepyandrologii.pl/pdf/Authors Statement.pdf>). This information will not be revealed to the reviewers.

■ Copyright information

When sending the manuscript with illustrations and tables, the author / authors automatically and free of charge transfer to "Advances in Andrology Online" and the Polish Society of Andrology all copyright to publish and distribute the submitted materials in all known forms and in all known types of use, with no territory or language limitations, on condition that the materials will be approved for publishing. Neither the publication as a whole nor any of its parts can be copied or published in any mechanical or electronic way without written consent from the Editor.

■ Personal data protection

The names and email addresses submitted into the service of the journal "Advances in Andrology Online" will be used only for the purposes of publication of their papers and will not be made available for any other purposes.

■ Peer review process

The submitted manuscripts are initially examined by the Editorial Committee of the journal. The manuscripts which are incomplete or not prepared according to the rules below will be sent back to authors without substantive review. Other articles are registered and then

forwarded to two independent reviewers for evaluation, maintaining the anonymity of authors and reviewers (double-blind peer review process). The reviewers are responsible for an objective assessment of the manuscript, declare a lack of conflict of interest when signing the statement (<http://www.postepyandrologii.pl/pdf/Formularz recenzenta ang. 09.06.2016.pdf>). The manuscript is accepted for publication on the basis of positive opinions of both reviewers. In case of disagreement, the Editorial Board asks a third reviewer for an opinion. The authors are obliged to refer to the reviewers' comments within three weeks of the receipt of the review. All correspondence with the authors is carried out via e-mail.

■ Manuscript preparation

Submitted manuscripts may be written in **Polish** or **English**.

Numerical values and symbols of all sizes should be given by the international system of units SI.

The manuscript should use 12-point **Times New Roman** font, while maintaining **1.5-point line spacing** and margins of 2.5 cm on each side. Pages should be numbered consecutively, starting with the title page. The page numbers should be placed in the lower right corner of each page. Please maintain the following **layout**: title page (separate page), abbreviations (separate page), abstract and keywords (up to 5) in Polish and English (separate page), body text, references, captions, figures and tables, illustrations.

The title page should contain: a degree, the name of the author (authors) and affiliation, email address, each author's contact phone number (name of the author for correspondence should be underlined), article title and an abbreviated version of the title (in Polish and English) (40 characters with spaces) and financing sources.

A list of abbreviations should be given in Polish and English in one paragraph, in alphabetical order, e.g.: hESC – human embryonic stem cells; ROS – reactive oxygen species; RT-PCR – reverse transcription polymerase chain reaction; etc. The abbreviations used in the main file for the first time should be given in full. Do not begin a sentence with an abbreviation.

The abstract should contain the most important information introducing the reader to the published topic and its conclusions (up to 400 words). Do not use abbreviations.

Main text

Review article should include an overview of the subject. It is recommended to include papers published in the last 5–10 years (60%) and in the previous years (40%). The permissible number of references is 100. In the manuscript authors should conclude their original thoughts, opinions and conclusions, and the relevant information should be presented in the form of diagrams, tables and

figures. Moreover, the article may be enriched with the results of author's own research. The number of pages of the manuscript, including tables and figures, should not exceed 20.

Original research paper should include a description of authors' own clinical or experimental studies.

It should consist of the following subsections: Introduction, Material and Methods, Results, Discussion, Summary. The permissible number of references is 100. The number of pages of the manuscript, including tables and figures should not exceed 20.

Case report is a short form of publication that presents interesting clinical cases and discussion based on clinician's practice own experience and experience of other authors. The abstract should not exceed 150 words, Introduction should contain no more than two short paragraphs, Material and Methods should not be divided into sections, and Results, Discussion and Conclusion should be in one chapter. The number of figures and tables should be reduced to 2–3 and references to 10. The number of pages of the manuscript should not exceed 10.

Communication article is a short original paper containing preliminary but important results. In this type of publications summary should not exceed 150 words, Introduction should contain no more than two short paragraphs, Material and Methods should not be divided into sections, and Results, Discussion and Conclusion should be in one chapter. The number of figures and tables is reduced to 2–3, references to 10. The number of pages of the manuscript should not exceed 10.

An article which is the translation of an English language publication should concern the most recent and significant items in the English-speaking literature. It should be accompanied by a consent of the Editor of the journal in which the article was published and the authors of the translation of the article. The summary of the article should include content which is important to provide for Polish readers (up to 400 words).

Letter to the Editor is a form of expressing one's opinion, which is at the same time a voice in the discussion on contemporary phenomena in the world of medicine and science. The permissible number of pages of the manuscript is no more than 3.

References should be given in the alphabetical order, not by entering the serial numbers. Each reference shall be entered on a new line. Please provide the last name of the author(s) in italics with their name initials, followed by a dot. If there are up to six authors, please cite all. Above this number the first six authors should be given with a note et al. The titles of journals should be abbreviated in accordance with the Index Medicus (Medline).

Here are examples of how to cite the book: 1) as a whole, 2) a fragment of a specific chapter, together with page numbers, 3) the original scientific paper, 4) original scientific paper in the electronic journal (data viewing and URL) and 5) website (page name – the source material, the URL and date of entry to the site):

References quoted in the text should be given alphabetically in parentheses, listing the first author and giving the year of publication, for example: (*Bungum et al.*, 2011; *Cheng et al.*, 2011). The names of the authors of articles entered in the text should be written in italics, for example:

“According to *Bungum et al.* (2011) to enter a specific algorithm for the treatment of male infertility, depending on the standard seminological parameters and the results obtained on the basis of a test using Acridine Orange revealing abnormal chromatin condensation in sperm (SCSA)..”

The references should contain the publications of other authors and of the authors' research team which are significant for the research.

Illustrative material includes figures (graphs, diagrams, pictures, outlines) and tables provided with titles and captions. In the case of figures both the title and description should be placed under the drawings, in the case of tables above the tables. The title of the table should be bolded. Captions of figures and tables and their titles, as well as inside information on the figures and in the tables should be given in Polish and English (for papers written in Polish). Figures and tables should be numbered consecutively according to the order in which they are mentioned in the text. Figures and tables should be provided separately (Arabic numbers). The abbreviation *Fig.* (in italics) is entered in the caption under the figures, while the title of the table does not use an abbreviation *Tab.* but *Table*. Please do not use in the main text abbreviations *fig.* or *tab.*, but *figure* or *table*.

Photomicrographs should have internal microscopic scale and used symbols, arrows, or letters must be clearly visible against the background. Capability of photomicrographs resolution should not be less than 300 dpi. Characters used to describe the given figure should be harmonized throughout the article.

Symbols and abbreviations used in figures and tables should be explained in the description of figures and tables, regardless of their development in the main text. **Note:** the individual figures or figures made from several images, charts, graphs or diagrams should be integrated with internal markings.

Size of figures and tables: the width of figures and tables should be **17.3 cm** or **8.3 cm**, and their length should not exceed **24.5 cm**. The text will be set in two columns, and therefore the width of figures and tables should not exceed the width of one or two columns, but it can be of any length, but not more than the length of the column; the size of the surface of the printed page A4 will amount to **24.7 cm / 17.5 cm**.

Sending the manuscript to the Editorial Office

The manuscripts should be sent electronically to the Editor's email address: mpiasecka@ipartner.com.pl

The main text, references and captures of figures and tables should be placed in a single file (Word), and each figure (CDR, TIF, JPG format) and tables (Word) in separate files. The title of the file containing the text of the manuscript should contain the name of the author for correspondence, and the first words of the article's title. The titles of the files containing figures and tables, next to the author's name, should include the numbers of figures and tables.

The manuscript must be accompanied by a statement that the submitted paper has not been published or directed for publication in another journal, has been approved by all co-authors (signatures of all the authors are required), and that all funding sources have been

disclosed (statement available on the website: http://www.postepyandrologii.pl/pdf/Oswiadczenie_autorow.pdf).

After acceptance

The papers will be published in the order in which they are submitted, though the Editorial Office reserves the right to changes justified by the contents of the published issue. Moreover, they reserve the right to make corrections in the style and regarding nomenclature, and the used abbreviations without consulting the author. After approving the paper for publishing the authors receive the proof. The purpose of the proof is to check the text for typesetting and conversion errors and the completeness and correctness of the text, tables and figures. The authors are obliged to send in any possible corrections within three days upon receiving the proof. Changing the title and/or authors' names and introducing any new values is prohibited.

Open Access

The information included in the journal is Open Access – the access to scientific information is free and unlimited. The users may read, download, copy, distribute, print, browse, combine information with full article texts or use them for any other purpose complying with the current license CC BY NC ND 3.0 Polska (<https://creativecommons.org/licenses/by-nc-nd/3.0/pl/legalcode>). The license obliges to recognise authorship, allows to distribute, present and play the piece for noncommercial purposes only and under the condition that it is maintained in its original form (without creating any dependent pieces).
